Wow! It's been a busy summer! Now that we're past Labor Day weekend, we now have a ton of training events coming up. Please don't forget the Lost in the Mist training event at Camp Powhatan September 27 – 29. If you haven't been on a simulation or a real mission, it would be-

hoove you to be at this simulation as it is the last planned simulation for a while. If you have been responding to BDSAR training events and missions, it still wouldn't hurt!

SAR resources across the Commonwealth have been very busy. Having spent a day at the Nelson Co incident, looking for Alexis Murphy, I can tell you that those folks were already exhausted from that search and moved on to two others. It's what we do – we go when we're called. Well, some of us do.

This is the time of year that I ask everyone to start looking at their commitment to Black Diamond SAR in preparation for the New Year. We always ask the same of everyone, every year, so this should only be news to the newer members. Think about why you're a member on this team and if you're contributing. If not, then how/what can you contribute to make Black Diamond successful in 2014?

We have several new members already signed up for FTM at Hungry Mother. We should have 5 or 6 new FTM's in November. Please make it a point to introduce yourself to these folks and welcome them to the BDSAR family. I'll be honest when I say that I believe I'm the only one on our team that knows every single BDSAR member, except for the newest applicants. If you see a BDSAR member that you don't know, please make it a point to meet them. Yes, I know we're a very large team, and we are



pretty dispersed, but you're going to be in the field with them, it helps to know them.

Thanks to all of those that stepped up to volunteer to dispatch. Even though this is not a very hard job, it's critical that it be handled a certain way. That being said, we will have a meeting in December or January which will be mandatory for those that wish to dispatch. Here you will learn the intricacies of dispatching and the "need to

know" information.

So why the push for dispatchers? Mike and I had been our only dispatchers for years. Rob Blevins stepped up about a year ago, maybe more, and that help has been huge. However; with the three of us, there's still been lapses in coverage where we've been lucky we weren't called. Daniel Murray has agreed to step up and be the Lead on this project and he has some interesting ideas about possibly cleaning up the process. Once we get it nailed down, we'll be set.

Dispatchers should be prepared to handle the calls when they are on the schedule. They need only volunteer to take dispatch when they can devote 100% of their time to the call. Especially when the call goes out. And they may not respond, as they are the lifeline between the mission and the EOC. Once people get dispatched and on the road, it slows down a little. We will go over all of that at the organizational meeting.

What are some things that you should be doing when you respond?

- A) Please let the dispatcher know you are responding. It happens on just about every mission, someone shows up that didn't let anyone know they were responding.
- B) Please let the dispatcher know when you are home after the mission has closed. After everyone is home, they should send out a text letting all members know that dispatch has been closed. No we haven't been doing a great job of that as dispatchers, but we're trying to get better.
- C) Don't send a text to me or Mike telling us you're responding if we are not the dispatchers. If you send it to me, and I'm responding, I'm probably going to put it low on my priority list if I'm not dispatching. The dispatcher provides information on whom to text your availabilities to.
- D) Please do not try to call us if we are not dispatching as we do not have the information, the dispatcher does. Get in touch with the dispatcher as they are the one talking to the EOC.

I know that's a lot of information, and I apologize, but this is the best way to get that information out to our members.
